


THE ICONIC WAUWINET HOTEL ON NANTUCKET IS ONCE AGAIN THE ULTIMATE SUMMER GETAWAY

The iconic hotel underwent a multi-million dollar renovation to spice up its spaces for the summer.





We suggest at the newly redesigned **Wauwinet**—a historic inn, which originally opened in 1875, which just underwent a multi-million dollar facelift. Boston-based design firm **Gauthier-Stacy** spearheaded the restoration and renovation of the hotel's lobby, library, and 32 guest bedrooms and cottages to create the perfect blend of luxury and comfort.

The rooms incorporate soft neutrals, tone-on-tone textiles, and nautical accents—but that's par for the course when it comes to a seaside resort. What's *not* par for the course are the four-poster beds topped with custom Pratesi by Rivolta linens and spacious bathrooms with walk-in showers and Carrara marble herringbone flooring. Luxury, meet comfort.
